



This collection contains the correspondence, post cards, handmade cards, notes, and drawings in German sent to Angela Davis while she was imprisoned awaiting trial in California.













#### MEET The National Committee to Abolish the Poll Tax

THE POLL TAX CAN BE ABOLISHED IN THIS CONGRESS

We in Washington are convinced it is possible—with your help. For that reason, in the months ahead we shall be calling on you more and more often.

When you get our letters, we want you to know who is sending them, why we are writing to you-and who pays the postage.

Who started the fight to free the ballot? And where? And when? And how?

The Anti-Poll Tax Fight Began in the South

The Southern people themselves, who saw the consequences of disfranchisement at close range, were the first to roll up their sleeves and tackle the job of freeing the ballot in their own states.

In 1938, under the leadership of the Southern Conference for Human Welfarn.

They studied the ways this tax was imbedded in their state constitutions. They petitioned their state legislatures. Traditionally reforms are won through the people's use of the ballot; the vast majority of the people in the poll tax states, because it, accel the job of winning this reform without that weapon.

The Southern people soon found they could not do the job by themselves in their separate states. Recognizing that democracy is indivisible, they appealed to the nation. They stood on their Constitutional rights as Americans. They turned to Countries.

PRESIDENT FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT: "The right to vote must be open to all citizens irrespective of race, color, or creed—without tax or artificial restriction of any kind. The sooner we get to that basis of political equality, the better it will be for the country as a whole."

persecution which has been imposed upon fifteen million Americans,

sepecially persecutes and denies american rights to the Negro people they are not its early victims because the lynch mob attacks and weakens the democratic and constitutional rights of all Americans. It is a threat to and an instrument against the whole labor and progressive movement of the rountry.







Lynching-1902
